From Bethlehem, the least of the clans of Judah, and from a peasant girl, Mary, one of the least of the Jewish people, God prepared a body for Jesus, the saviour of the world. As we rejoice in the saviour who has come to visit us, we also join Elizabeth in praising Mary for her faith, her love and her obedience.

Seven antiphons, each starting with the interjection "O", consecutively lead off the Canticum of Our Lady in Evening Prayer during the Liturgy of the Hours for the 9 days preceding Christmas. Addressed to the Messiah with an appeal that He come, each recognizes a Messianic attribute. Most of the texts can be derived from either prophetic or wisdom books of the Old Testament. The attributes used are: O Wisdom; O Sacred Lord; O Flower of Jesse's stem; O Key of David; O Radiant Dawn; O King of all the nations; O Emmanuel.
