I Have Much More to Tell You

Had Jesus run out of time? Why didn't he tell his disciples everything he had in mind? Had the Last Supper taken too long?

No, Jesus' timing was always perfect. He knew his hour had come—it hadn't snuck up on him. And he was always ready for whatever he had to do. Rather, Jesus had "much more" to teach his disciples because they weren't ready to hear it. They couldn't understand everything yet. They needed time and experience and a lot of help from the Holy Spirit.


