The Annual Mass count of people at Mass is conducted each May. Average Mass attendance at St Gabriel's & St Stephen's this year was 264 people each weekend. In the light of this year's Mass count, the Vicar General, Fr Joseph Caddy, comments:

In 2022, approximately 79,000 people attended Mass each week compared to about 124,000 in 2019 a drop of about 45,000 people.

Comparing the 2022 to 2019 Mass counts:

- about 32% of parishes have had more than 70% of their parishioners return
- 56% have had more than 60% return
- 22% have had less than 50% return

This is worth us exploring further. It seems like we are hopefully over the worst when it comes to Covid-19. I doubt that we will return to the lockdowns that characterised the last couple of years but sensible precautions still should be maintained.

Did he have a servant clear the poor man off the doorstep before he came or went? Did he keep his eyes upward as he walked? It can be hard to understand how this man, who dressed in fine garments and ate "sumptuously," could have ignored the poor man who suffered just under his nose (Luke 16:19). He must have been pretty callous to step over Lazarus and just go on his way!

And yet it happens all the time. Just look at the people in the first reading: "Stretched comfortably on their couches,... they are not made ill by the collapse of Joseph!" (Amos 6:4, 6). Obviously, it happens in our time too. It's easy to become numb to the plight of those who are suffering or in need. Busyness can get the better of us. Or fear of getting involved. Or just a tinge of that self-concern that had so consumed the rich man in the parable.

We ourselves may be guilty of looking the other way sometimes when we encounter another person's need. Think about the homeless man on the footpath that you drive by on your way to work. Or that young mum in your neighbourhood who could use a listening car or a helping hand. Or the people at the local nursing home with no one to visit them. How often do we "step over" them on our way to somewhere else?

Given today's readings, it's a good time to examine how we treat people who are less fortunate than we are. The truth is, we can't take care of everyone's needs. But we can ask the Lord to help us see people through his eyes. We can try to be sensitive to the Holy Spirit showing us a need. And we can trust that if we feel God is asking us to do something, he will give us the grace to respond.

HOLY ARCHANGELS 29 SEPTEMBER

This is a unique feast day! Feast days dedicated to saints naturally encourage us to examine the life of that saint and reflect on how we can follow their example in our own lives. But it would certainly be hard to do this when it comes to archangels. After all, they're... angelic!

However, we still can celebrate the work that these archangels have done on our behalf and strive to follow their example of quick obedience and love for God. Let's consider what we can learn from each one of the archangels we celebrate today.

St. Michael is best known for doing battle against Lucifer. We believe that St. Michael continues to serve God by interceding for us when we need protection against the snares of the devil. This is not just a single battle; it requires daily vigilance and fortitude against temptation. Like St. Michael, we can make sure we are wearing the "armour of God" each day so that we are always ready to fight the spiritual battle (Ephesians 6:11).

St. Gabriel is the messenger angel who brought God's world-changing news to Mary and who told Zechariah about the birth of his son, John the Baptist. Following Gabriel's example, we can try to be more attuned to listening to the Lord and more eager to share what we hear. His example of delivering good news should encourage us to not hesitate to deliver the good news of God's love to the people around us.

Disguised as a man, St. Raphael accompanied Tobias on his dangerous journey, where he cast out an evil spirit and helped Tobias cure his father's blindness. Following Raphael's lead, we can also be "angels" to people we meet and accompany them on their walk through the ups and downs of life.

These three archangels are always ready to hear God's mission for them and fulfil it immediately. May we follow their example and make ourselves instruments of God's grace to everyone he sends us to.
