



The liturgy of the Eucharist unfolds according to a fundamental structure which has been preserved throughout the centuries down to our own day. It displays two great parts that form a fundamental unity:

-the gathering, the liturgy of the Word, with readings, homily, and general intercessions;

-the liturgy of the Eucharist, with the presentation of the bread and wine, the consecratory thanksgiving, and communion.

The liturgy of the Word and liturgy of the Eucharist together form "one single act of worship" the Eucharistic table set for us is the table both of the Word of God and of the Body of the Lord.

Is this not the same movement as the Paschal meal of the risen Jesus with his disciples? Walking with them he explained the Scriptures to them; sitting with them at table "he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them." Catechism of the Catholic Church 1346, 1347

In today's familiar Gospel, a disciple named Cleopas and his companion walked the road from Jerusalem to Emmaus. They were leaving Jerusalem, a place of disappointment and dashed hopes, where their Master had suffered and died. But on that path of sadness and doubt, Jesus spoke and "opened the Scriptures" to them, even though they failed to recognize him.

Patiently, Jesus explained how all the Scriptures pointed to him. Step- by-step, the risen One brought their faith back to life. Perhaps the women's story of an empty tomb could be true! Could this have been God's plan all along? Slowly, their grief-stricken hearts grew warm; they hungered to hear more. "Stay with us," they pleaded. And once he broke the bread, their eyes were opened: they knew it was Jesus.

Today the same Jesus who walked the road to Emmaus will be speaking to you through the Scriptures at Mass. These aren't just wise words from a gifted teacher or an ancient book. It is Jesus himself, the living Word of God, speaking to you. He will meet you wherever you are: whether you're just starting out in your journey of faith or you've been following him for years. Whether you have questions or you're sure of what you believe, Jesus will still open his word to you. He loves to stir your heart!

Don't you want the hope that comes from hearing Jesus speak his words? Don't you want more confidence that he will speak to you through his words? And don't you want deeper faith that he is truly present, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, on the altar? Jesus wants this even more than you do!

Open your heart to the Lord; listen as he speaks through his word. He will not disappoint. wau.org

In 2025. the Dominican Sisters of the Most Holy Rosary of the Philippines celebrate 100years since their foundation. Founded by Venerable Mother Rosario Arroya of the Visitation, they have an extensive Apostolate of education, and social and pastoral outreach to the poor in the Philippines and USA, and a mission to handicapped and disabled children in Kenya. The Mother House at Iloilo, Philippines is home to the Mother General and Council, elderly and retired Sisters, and junior Sisters, including young women discerning the religious life. Priests, Seminary rectors and young professionals (doctors, lawyers) can be found among the alumni of their schools.

The Sisters gave me a generous and warm welcome. Mother General presided over a meeting of their Council. I was able to present the needs of Reservoir and Preston West area, with proposals around *Take the Way of the Gospel*. I spoke about pastoral needs, outreach to families and women, children's catechesis, ministry among the young, visitation, formation opportunities, RCIA. Mother General and Council wish to visit Reservoir and Preston West to see-judge-act:

- To see for themselves our local situation, proposed accommodation (St Raphael's Presbytery)
- To judge our proposal, and to confirm that it is consistent with their apostolic mission
- To determine that they can live the demands of their spiritual regime, including sung daily Office, daily Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, Holy Rosary and regular life
- To satisfy themselves that their Melbourne apostolate can be sustained, eg: income, car, facilities, resources
- Finally, to *act*: having received formal invitation from the Archbishop of Melbourne, the new Mother General and Council (to be elected at Chapter in July 2023), will decide on a new foundation in Australia

The Sisters of the Most Holy Rosary are not afraid of hard work and a difficult apostolate. The Sisters are characteristically joyful, active, inspired by their founders to respond to the needs of the Church, to serve the poor while remaining humble, poor and simple themselves. Their community life is warm, charitable and regular, based on daily prayer and common life. They want to see the Catholic Church grow. Their foundress, Mother Rosario, wrote in her book of reflection:

"To love God with all your heart, with all your strength is to use in the service of Him your material possessions, talents, power, achievements and authority. Let us not leave work undone, let us sacrifice our time, ourselves and the rest for the glory and honour of God".
