Speaking at the Wednesday General Audience, Pope Francis expressed his "sorrow and concern" for the war that has broken out between Israel and Hamas, an Islamist militant organization operating in Palestine. The Pope mourned the many people who have been killed and injured. "I pray for those families who have seen a day of celebration turned into a day of mourning and ask for the immediate release of the hostages," he said. Militants from Hamas launched a surprise attack on the southern part of Israel on Saturday, as Jews marked the feast of Simchat Torah, or "joy of the Torah". Hamas took dozens of hostages during its incursion into Israel and has threatened to execute them if Israel attacks areas within the Gaza Strip. In his appeal, Pope Francis acknowledged that "it is the right of those who are attacked to defend themselves". However, he expressed concern for the "total siege facing the Palestinians in Gaza, where there have also been many innocent victims." Israel announced a "complete siege" on Gaza, promising to shut off access to electricity, food, water, and gas. The Pope invited both parties to restraint in hopes of reaching a solution to the war. "Terrorism and extremism do not help to reach a solution to the conflict between Israelis and Palestinians, but fuel hatred, violence, and revenge, causing suffering to both sides," he said. Pope Francis concluded his appeal for peace in the Middle East with a call for fraternity and dialogue. "The Middle East does not need war but peace, a peace built on justice, dialogue, and the courage of fraternity." he said. Vatican News 11 October 2023

#### **SWEET CHAIN II**



The Rosary developed over many centuries, and it took a number of different forms. Many of us learned the three sets of five mysteries when we were in school. This traditional praying of the 150 Hail Marys was a mirror of the 150 Psalms that monks prayed, and the Rosary became a sort of poor person's Psalter. These Mysteries have served the Church well, and countless millions of Catholics have found solace and closeness to Christ by praying them in union with the Blessed Mother.

However, Catholic spirituality cannot remain stagnant. It constantly evolves. In other times we can find variations on the rosary, such as the seven-decade Franciscan Crown. This variation on the traditional rosary dates back to the 15th century and is still prayed by many today. About 100 years ago St Faustina Kowalska promoted the Divine Mercy Chaplet. This prayer uses the traditional rosary beads, but prays different prayers on them to form a beautiful new devotion. So, in this sense, we must allow any valid and Catholic development in devotion. At his vantage point, as the Successor of Peter and the man who was Pope at the dawn of the Third Millennium. Pope John Paul II saw how beneficial it could be to modify the Rosary for our times by adding five new Mysteries of Light, or Luminous Mysteries, to the traditional 15 Mysteries.

In the letter John Paul II explains how, "I believe... that to bring out fully the Christological depth of the Rosary it would be suitable to make an addition to the traditional pattern which, while left to the freedom of individuals and communities, could broaden it to include the mysteries of Christ's public ministry between his Baptism and his Passion. In the course of those mysteries, we contemplate important aspects of the person of Christ as the definitive revelation of God. Declared the beloved Son of the Father at the Baptism in the Jordan, Christ is the one who announces the coming of the Kingdom, bears witness to it in his works and proclaims its demands. It is during the years of his public ministry that the mystery of Christ is most evidently a mystery of light; 'While I am in the world, I am the light of the world."

Speaking of these new Mysteries, the Pope explains that "each of these mysteries is a revelation of the Kingdom now present in the very person of Jesus." The list adds these decades to the Rosary: Christ's Baptism in the Jordan; his self-manifestation at the wedding of Cana; his proclamation of the Kingdom of God, with his call to conversion; his Transfiguration; and his institution of the Eucharist. These are an important "sacramental expression of the Paschal Mystery."

Now that the new Millennium has definitively started the world today is in just as much need of the redemption of Christ as ever before. Yet in the midst of all our problems, we have this venerable prayer that is a "sweet chain linking us to God."
