Many kings had failed in this regard, which is why the people were waiting for a Messiah-King, a son of David who would again build a great nation as David had. Then along came Jesus, a Messiah who told people to love their enemies and turn the other cheek. What kind of a king was this?

In today's second reading, St Paul shows us what kind of a king Jesus is—One who has conquered our true enemies: Satan, sin and death. Jesus didn't come to win a battle between nations; instead, he came to win a cosmic battle with everlasting consequences. That's why we celebrate him today as 'King of the Universe'.

Unlike an earthly king, Jesus did not engage his enemies with armaments of war. No, he defeated them by dying on a cross. Through his death and resurrection, he saved not just Israel but all who believe in him. Out of his great love for each one of us, Jesus offered himself up, disarming the devil and draining sin of its power. Now we are forgiven, redeemed, and given the grace to love and forgive others as he has done for us. And though we still see evil in the world, we know that Jesus will destroy "every sovereignty and every authority and power" when he comes again.

Today at Mass, lets recommit ourselves to living under the reign of this great King. Lets tell him that we are ready to join him in rescuing his creation from the powers of darkness. Our King has already shown us how to do this: by offering ourselves in love to one another. Because without a doubt, love is the most powerful force in the universe! wau.org

### PARISH THANKSGIVING

The new series of Parish Thanksgiving envelopes commences next weekend 2-3 December.

Thank you for your ongoing commitment and generous personal support of St Gabriel's & St Stephen's Parish. Each member of Parish Thanksgiving is valued and appreciated!

On 29 September, the feast of the Archangels, St Gabriel and St Stephen of Hungary joined in partnership with St Raphael's Preston West. Over the next 12 months we have a lot to do to progress and consolidate this partnership. Archbishop Comensoli has appointed Fr Aurelio Fragapane an assistant priest in the partnership. In recent weeks Mother Nemia OP and Sr Arlene OP visited St Gabriel's, St Stephen's and St Raphael's. Please God the Dominican Sisters of the Most Holy Rosary will establish a community amongst us in the near future. Their presence will enrich parish life and bring fresh energies to apostolate with families, children, women and young parishioners.

Your Thanksgiving enables our parish to sustain and build with RCIA and mens ministry. 6 young parishioners attended World Youth Day in Portugal (August). They meet each 1st Sunday in St Gabriel's Parish Centre for catechesis and social time together. We were represented at the diocesan Proclaim Conference in November 16/18. St Gabriel's Theatre Group presented 'Fiddler on the Roof' to large and appreciative audiences (Nov 21-25).

Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools administers Catholic primary schools and diocesan colleges since 1 January 2020. At this time, \$1 peppercorn rent per annum is payable, with rent promised (but not guaranteed) from January 2024. St Gabriel's MACS pays \$1500 per annum for the use of St Gabriel's Hall, but this certainly does not meet all outlays. St Stephen's MACS does not use St Stephen's Hall. The Parish keeps a record of Hall expenses incurred by St Gabriel's school. In 2023, 100 children were enrolled at St Gabriel's primary school (50 Catholics) and 40 at St Stephen's primary school (6 Catholics).

Sincere thanks for your loyalty to the Catholic Church and our Parish. Thank you, too, for your personal support. It is a joy to be Parish priest of St Gabriel's & St Stephen's! Post Covid-19 Parish and Church life is still unsettled. Our Parish Finance Committee calls all of us to maintain our support, and to try to double our contribution to the Presbytery collection (down 50% pre Covid-19). This important collection supports and only our pastor, but also our bishops and priests in needy parishes.

At Christmas we provide extra support to our Bishops and priests, retired and sick priests. The Christmas offering envelope is included in our parish Thanksgiving envelopes. Christmas offering envelopes are also available at St Gabriel's and St Stephen's churches.
